They will move into 167 Myers Corners Road, Wappingers Falls in Fall of 2010

WAPPINGERS FALLS, NY – According to Chuck Genck of Thylan Associates, Solid State Cooling Systems (SSCS) will occupy 19,000 sf of manufacturing and office space at the Dutchess Corporate Center, located on Myers Corners Road in Wappingers Falls, NY. Dutchess County Economic Development Corporation (DCEDC) worked closely with SSCS in evaluating buildings in the county.

The Dutchess Corporate Center (DCC) is a complex of three buildings with a total of 510,000 sf. built in the mid 80's by IBM as a software lab and data center. Two buildings were sold to Laerdal Medical in the early 90's and then to Thylan Associates in 2004. Laerdal Medical and CERVALIS, an internet company, are the main tenants.
